Survey of Graduating Residents

RHAP sent our survey to graduating residents across the U.S., and received 110 survey responses. 63 of these respondents wanted a mentor, help integrating abortion into their practices, additional training, and/or to be added to the Access

list. Thank you to all of you who encouraged your residents to complete the survey, and thank you to all of you who are mentoring new physicians. 2011 marks the fifth year that RHAP has been surveying graduating residents. We are now working with two researchers to analyze these five years of data to identify how intent to provide abortion care when entering residency impacts how doctors actually practice, and what supports are most helpful in enabling doctors to integrate abortion into their practices.
