The Patch Ortho Evra®	 Apply a new patch once a week for three weeks No patch in week 4 	 Can irritate skin under the patch Can make monthly bleeding more regular and less painful May cause spotting the first few months 	93%	Withdrawal Pull-out	• Pull penis out of vagina before ejaculation (that is, before coming)	 Costs nothing Less pleasure for some Does not work if penis is not pulled out in time Must interrupt sex 	80%
